





The amount of homework in this course is unbelievable. There are 5 term papers, plus two other papers, a couple of weekly assignments, and weekly quizzes, and exams. I had to drop a class to keep up with this one. It was way too much work. Although, the teacher is an easy grader. If I had known how easy (like turning in an assignment on time gets extra points), then I probably would have not dropped it. But it was just way too much work.

The course got me thinking about certain topics, which required a thorough explanation. It also allowed me to try different techniques when creating papers or presentations that I had not worked with before and were challenging at first.

There is a lot of large assignments which at times were hard to keep up with. However it was worth it as it helped me learn so much.

This course was not difficult material wise, but load wise. The Term Report project was fairly time consuming along with all the other smaller assignments. However, the workload wasn't impossible it was just challenging to manage sometimes.

This course has an extremely heavy work load. Even so, this work isn't hard. It's mostly busy work that actually helps you learn about the entire course itself. The video assignments and reports take up a ton of time. But you actually value all that you learn in the end. It may seem bad in the beginning, but by the end of this class, you appreciate all the work you put in and everything that you were able to learn.

I personally felt like it was a lot but I had 6 classes so a regular schedule would be manageable.

There have been a lot of assignments that I found took much more time than other classes.

The material was a great level of moderately challenging, however there was A LOT of it which made it seem not easily manageable.

This class has a lot of writing assignments that take a ton of time, I was spending 12–15hr's per term report. I found them challenging. If there was more it might be overwhelming.

There are a lot of papers to write but the due dates flexible.

Dr. Schlosser is one of the best instructors I've ever had, I would suggest other professors take a note on how he does things, like the youtube video's. Those are really useful.







I would spend at least twice the amount of time on this class than I did some others. I received a good grade for it, but it was a lot to do for a 3 credit mid–high level class. If this class was counted as a 4–5 credit, the workload would make a lot more sense. So if the course could be more concise if it remains only 3 credits that would be great for future students. I still am very glad that I learned all I did from Dr. Bill's course though.

He could learn to take breaks between speaking.

Make the content a little more organized by due dates.

I honestly have zero way he could improve his teaching, he has been wonderful.

The only improvement I have to offer Dr. Bill is to perhaps start the class out a little slower. I was pretty overwhelmed for the first few weeks of class. I would suggest starting out with a few less major assignments and perhaps a little slower learning curve for at least the first week or so, until the students adjust to their feel of the class. That is honestly the only improvement I can come up with that would have helped me out in this class.

Outline what is needed for assignments in a concise and organized way. I would often be very confused on the objective of an assignment from the class discussion of that assignment and the written instructions for this assignment.

Nothing on the teaching. It was well taught, straightforward and understandable.

Dr.Bill is an amazing professor but should space out deadlines slightly different. When doing the essay assignments for the class, which I feel add to your understanding of the material should give a couple more assignments through out the beginning of the semester/course.

He should spend a little bit more time on topics in class versus reminding folks about deadlines, which is helpful but perhaps add more of a time limit as to how long one talks about it.

If Dr. Bill could improve anything in his teaching, I would suggest having the Term Reports graded before the YouTube video is due. I still had a great experience and learned how to create a video through powerpoint, but I do wish I were able to take any possible suggestions into consideration when creating the video.

The course schedule in the syllabus was confusing. It could be reorganized to make it easier to read.

Have less video assignments towards the end of the semester so students can work on the final project instead

I found that the directions had a lot of information but not as clear.

Slower pace of teaching/learning material

All the assignments/quizzes were great, however there were A LOT of them. Perhaps decreasing the amount would reduce stress on both parties (teacher & student) throughout the semester.

Slightly faster turn around on some of the term reports. I understand this semester has been a rough due to covid but it's been weeks on some of them.

Some topics needed a bit more explanation but not too much.

I would say possibly spending more time in class talking about the material in the videos we watch outside of class.

Dr. Bill easily had the best "zoom" course I have had at WSU!



I find it valuable when we can connect the information to other courses because I can find connections about the topic to understand it better.


